Your son/daughter has expressed a desire to become a member of a Glendale School District athletic team. The athletic staff and administration of the district feel there is certain information concerning such membership which may be helpful to you. Please read this information carefully with your child, sign where appropriate, and return to the school.

1. Each athlete must have proof of a physical examination before participating in an athletic program. Further, it is mandatory that proof of a physical examination be RENEWED every two years.
2. The athlete is responsible for all equipment checked out to him/her. All equipment checked out to him/her must be turned in or paid for before the athlete will be allowed to practice or compete in another sport. No awards will be given to athletes who have not checked in or paid for equipment for which they are responsible. All athletic equipment checked out to the athlete is to be worn only during athletic contests or to school on the day of the contest.
3. The school district makes available to the parent an insurance plan for grades K-12. Each participant must either purchase this plan or show evidence that he/she is effectively covered by some other form of accident insurance. (School insurance does not apply to out of school activities unless insurance is purchased as a full-time plan).
4. It is understood that Glendale School District is not liable for any medical, dental, or hospital bills occurring as a result of athletic injuries incurred by a student while participating in a supervised sport and that such bills, in excess of insurance benefits, shall be the responsibility of the student's parents or guardians.
5. All squad members are expected to conform to the rules of scholastic eligibility, participation, and training as prescribed by the Oregon School Activities Association, Glendale School District and the activity/athletic coaching staffs.
6. An athlete must be in school the entire day to be eligible for that day's practice or game. If the contest is held on a non- school day, the student must be in school the entire previous school day in order to participate. The only exception to that rule will be if you have a medical or professional appointment, you will need to bring back a note from their office for an excuse in order to participate in an activity.
7. I give my permission for my son/daughter to participate in athletic activities. I realize that such participation involves the potential for injury which is inherent in all sports. I acknowledge that even with the best coaching, use of protective equipment and strict observance of rules, injuries are still a possibility. On rare occasions, these injuries can be so severe as to result in total disability, paralysis, or even death.
8. Participants in Glendale School District Athletics may be required to pay a user fee set by the Glendale School Board. The user fee, if any, must be paid by the first contest.

GLENDALE SCHOOL DISTRICT ATHLETIC CODE OF CONDUCT

1. Students are subject to OSAA and Glendale School District rules concerning academic eligibility. Students must be enrolled with a full schedule, maintain a 2.0 GPA, have no failing grades, and be on track to graduate. Students must follow team rules regarding grades while participating in any sport or activity.
2. While representing the Glendale School District as a team member, stealing and/or vandalism may result in dismissal from the team for the remainder of the sports season.
3. Athletes are required to come to practice. An excused absence from practice or competition is when the athlete contacts the coach if he/she cannot be at the practice/competition. An unexcused absence from practice or competition is when an athlete is in school the day of practice or competition and misses practice/competition without talking to the coach. It is the athlete's responsibility for contacting the coach if he/she cannot be at the practice/competition. Consequences concerning missed practices and contests will be covered in the team rules.
4. If an athlete misses any class or partial class during the day, other than with a doctor's note, the athlete will not be able to participate in that day's activities, whether it is a practice or a game. Special circumstances are at the discretion of the principal.
5. The athlete will travel with the team to all away competitions. Athletes will not be released to ride to home from away competitions with anyone other than their parent or legal guardian or a signed note from the principal.
6. Any athlete dismissed from a team will not practice or travel with his/her respective team or any other team during that sports season. If an athlete is dismissed from a team, that athlete shall not be allowed to participate in another sport during that sport season. If an athlete quits a team and wants to join another team during the same sports season, both coaches must agree. A season is considered over when the team is no longer competing in that sport.
7. Any athlete who is academically ineligible may practice but cannot travel with his/her respective team or any other team during the period of ineligibility.

Right to Appeal: Any disciplinary action or actions resulting in dismissal from the team may be appealed if done so in writing and given to the Athletic Director within 5 days from the dismissal. The coach, athletic director and principal will review the appeal.

**GLENDALE SCHOOL DISTRICT ILLEGAL DRUG/ALCOHOL
AND TOBACCO POLICY**

Glendale School District student athletes shall not possess, use, transmit or be under the influence of illegal drugs, alcohol, or tobacco of any kind, nor shall the participant have in his/her possession any paraphernalia associated with the above during the OSAA calendar year. Participants will be found in violation of this policy if they are not personally using but remain in the presence of individuals who are violating this policy. Any infraction occurring during the OSAA calendar year will result in consequences being enforced for a calendar year from the date of discovery during the present or next athletic activity in which the student participates. Participants who find themselves in jeopardy because of a substance abuse problem should seek professional assistance. Glendale School District has made the following decision and consequences regarding the use of illegal drugs, including alcoholic beverages and tobacco during the Oregon School Activities Association (OSAA) calendar year.

USE OR POSSESSION OF ILLEGAL DRUGS

Immediate indefinite team suspension, pending possible recommendation for expulsion from school.

USE AND/OR POSSESSION OF ALCOHOL AND/OR ATTENDING PLACES WHERE ILLEGAL ACTIVITIES ARE OCCURRING

First offense

The student will be suspended from interscholastic competition according to the following formula:

Up to 45 activity calendar days to be determined by the Athletic Director, Coach and Principal.

Suspension may carry from one activity season into the next in which the athlete participates.

The student-athlete will be able to practice during the suspension

The student may be required to comply with additional recommendations from administration before being permitted to rejoin the athletic/activity program.

Second Offense

The student will be fully suspended from the athletic/activity program for a period of (1) calendar year.

The student will become ineligible to receive awards or letters for the sport being played when the incident occurred.

The student may be required to comply with additional recommendations from administration before being permitted to rejoin the athletic/activity program.

Third Offense

The student will become ineligible for athletic competition, practice or squad memberships indefinitely. Future eligibility to be reviewed by the building administrator and district athletic director.

USE OR POSSESSION OF TOBACCO

First offense

Suspension from the next two active athletic contests.

The student may be required to comply with additional recommendations from administration before being permitted to rejoin the athletic/activity program.

The student athlete will be able to practice during the suspension.

Second Offense

The student will be suspended from interscholastic competition according to the following formula:

45 activity calendar days from discover date in any activity season in which the student participates.

Suspension may carry from one activity season into the next in which the athlete participates.

The student-athlete will be able to practice during the suspension.

The student may be required to comply with additional recommendations from administration before being permitted to rejoin the athletic/activity program.

Third Offense

The student will be fully suspended from the athletic/activity program for a period of (1) calendar year.

The student will become ineligible to receive awards or letters for the sport being played when the student was apprehended.

The student may be required to comply with additional recommendations from administration before being permitted to rejoin the athletic/activity program.

ATTENDING PLACES WHERE ILLEGAL ACTIVITIES ARE OCCURRING

Student-athletes shall not remain at any site where illegal activities such as consumption of illegal drugs or alcohol by minors is occurring.

First Offense

The student will be suspended from interscholastic competition according to the following formula:

30 activity calendar days from discover date in any activity season in which the student participates.

Suspension may carry over from one activity season to the next in which the athlete participates.

The student athlete will be able to practice during the suspension.

The student may be required to comply with additional recommendations from administration before being permitted to rejoin the athletic/activity program.

Second Offense

The student will be fully suspended from the athletic/activity program for a period of (1) calendar year.

The student will become ineligible to receive awards or letters for the sport being played when the student was apprehended.

The student may be required to comply with additional recommendations from administration before being permitted to rejoin the athletic/activity program.

Third Offense

The student will become ineligible for athletic competition, practice or squad memberships indefinitely. Future eligibility to be reviewed by the building administrator and district athletic director.
