Written Report/Discussion

- First, Bridget would like to formally acknowledge our new teacher Sydney, who has an AG Science Masters from OSU. She had been a teacher in another area for a bit. She is currently subbing for Jack, has already started work on the FFA charter, and started the CTE application. The work that Sydney and Jack are doing is helping students have an avenue after graduation with a trade.
- Out of the graduates, 27 out of the 28 have a clear plan regarding secondary education. So many thanks to Misty Morningstar, Susie and Rebecca Clark who funded the CNA program entirely on grant funding. We are hoping to have enough students in the program for next year. In addition to that, Bridget is honored to acknowledge the two gentlemen that are choosing to join the Marines to serve our country, Alfred and Howard. They both received scholarships. Thanks to Jack and Sam who cooked all the meat, and Jasmine, Michelle, and Susie, who helped put on an amazing event for our seniors.
- Private school voucher system – will potentially take 20 million to implement – it will come out of other school budgets. The school board can reach out about their feelings regarding the decision.
- They did approve not addressing the 11% cap in special education, unfortunately they also sent out a dire forecast. As of May 14th, the budget forecast puts the state at 500 million less than they thought they would have. It matters to us because Glendale is at 17% - we get up to 11%.

- Bridget will be spending the rest of the month filling out all assurances and making sure all grants are done. IDEA is being funded, Title 1A – at risk and high needs, we haven't received numbers or allocations yet. Lots of budget concerns district wide. PERS Unfunded Act passed. Unemployment for union strike is pending – they don't believe they have the votes. Class Size Mandatory Bargaining Unit not going to pass. They believe they have secured the 11.3 funding level.
